Presidents Message

Hello Fellow Palomino Rabbit Breeders!

We've had a mixed bag of weather here in western Kansas this last month or two. We've had wonderful moisture that has helped us replenish some of our ground water. Farmers have been smiling most of the spring and I've heard no complaints from them about the amount of precipitation we've received this year. In fact, the only complaints I have heard about the moisture has been from some city folks. It seems they weren't too happy about it raining during a weekend. I won't even go into a discussion about that.

How have you been doing with your breeding programs? Mine is, well, it has been successful as far as numbers of litters. Maybe I haven't been quite as successful in steering toward the direction I'm wanting to go with improving the overall quality of my herd. I had bred 13 does in early May and had 13 does kindle over the last weekend of May. I raise both Pals and Satins and many of those does were first time mothers that have raised their kits just fine. I lost 3 of those litters due to abandonment, but I cannot help but think that was just my fault. My last batch of litters I was 4 for 8. Still a pretty good average considering the time of year and all. I missed the last breeding opportunity so will have to wait a week or 10 days before I try again.

Right now I'm mostly just trying to get numbers of kits to select from. Getting a good quality herd takes time and numbers. I haven't shown too often this year. I did make it to our spring nationals where I got thumped by just about everyone who was showing Pals. That's okay, though. That kind of weekend is a bitter pill to swallow, but it really serves to put everything into the proper perspective. I've eliminated several older does and a few bucks from the breeding program and am focusing on getting some better breeding stock out of some of the Pals I picked up in Fort Worth. I am particularly pleased with some of the young lynx does produced by a nice doe that I got from Kenneth and Imogene Drews. I'm very anxious to see how they mature.

We've had some BIS winners and some RIS winners here and there around the country and I congratulate each and every one of them, not just on their wins, but also on working with their herds to develop top quality rabbits.

I want to mention a couple of people who are in need of your prayers. I know that Joe Donato, our District 6 Director, has made great progress recovering from his surgeries, but I think he still has a ways to go before he is completely back in the pink. I want to wish him the best and hope he heals quickly without complications. I also understand that Carolyn Wright, our Sweepstakes Chairperson, had taken a tumble after an earlier surgery and that set her back a bit. If I knew the details I would share them with you. I sure hope she gets healed up and going again! Being laid up when there are things to do is no fun at all.

I haven't made my reservations, yet, but I am planning to attend the convention this fall in Portland. I hope to see many of my friends there and I am looking forward to meeting new Pal breeders that I don't know. I also plan to take along a few lynx and golden Pals so that every other breeder who is showing can take a good shot at me with their Pals.

Please stay safe out there, especially on the highways when you're traveling to and from shows. A special thank you to all of my officers and district directors for helping to promote our wonderful breed and for all the work you do that makes my job so easy. Thanks, also, to all of you for raising the breed that I love.
